Testing and Inspection

Why do you have to have it?

The EW Regs 1989 require that employers take precautions against the risk of death and personal injury from electricity in work activities.

The HSW Act 1974 states that employers are responsible for ensuring the safety and health of their employees and also the public. This includes electrical safety.

BS 7671: 2001 states that electrical systems should be periodically tested and inspected, at recommended intervals.

Compliance with BS7671: 2001 is likely to achieve compliance with the relevant aspects of the ESW Regs and HSW act



How often?

How often do these tests have to take place?

- Domestic property - every ten years or upon change of occupancy
- Commercial property - every five years or upon change of occupancy
- Industrial property - every three years
- PAT Testing - Annually

Periodic Inspection

The purpose of the Periodic Test and Inspection of the electrical installation is to determine whether it is in a satisfactory condition for continued service. All defects and non-compliances are recorded and will form part of the final report, as set out in BS 7671: 2001.

This report is recognised by insurance companies, HSE and Local Authorities
